

WHY CELEBRATE SCIENCE



Will Durant famously observed that "the health of nations is more important than the wealth of nations." Wealth follows health. More than half of economic growth in the past century is attributable to advances in the biosciences, where investments provide long-term benefits through increased productivity, job creation, lower healthcare costs and cheaper energy. More important, bioscience has given millions of people worldwide the incalculable gifts of longer lives, less suffering, greater hope and more time with loved ones. That's worth celebrating.

In September 2012, FasterCures – the Milken Institute's Center for Accelerating Medical Solutions – convened more than 1,000 leaders in medical research, patient advocacy, industry, philanthropy and public policy. The Celebration of Science weekend was the culmination of two decades of work, including a March on Washington that united hundreds of thousands of patients, families, doctors and advocates on the Mall. In the years following the 1998 March, Congress greatly expanded the resources of the National Institutes of Health, the National Cancer Institute and the National Science Foundation.

Those investments drove extraordinary progress, and we're now at the dawn of a new scientific revolution that will not only reduce the cost of health care but will save, extend and improve the quality of people's lives across the planet. Science and technology advances of the past two decades have transformed the impossible into the routine. Processes that once took years and cost millions now can be performed quickly and inexpensively. As just one important example, the original sequencing of the human genome took more than a decade and cost billions of dollars; today it's approaching two hours and \$1,000.

As impressive and transformative as those advances have been, they're merely a prologue of what's to come if we maintain our commitment. Solutions to many seemingly intractable global challenges are within our grasp. There's hope for millions of individuals around the world struggling with life-threatening or debilitating diseases, and for their families. Bioscience can help us produce abundant nutritious food and provide greater access to clean water, and it promises to help the world develop environmentally sustainable energy, provide defense against pandemics and reduce poverty in developing nations.

That's why we hosted the Celebration of Science in Washington, DC and why we've continued the initiative with events in London, Singapore and New York. By bringing together a diverse range of leaders, we hope to forge a uniquely bipartisan consensus about the importance of bioscience.

It's time to reaffirm our commitment.

An Event Two Decades in the Making

The Celebration of Science unofficially launched two decades ago with work that led to the first-ever Cancer Summit in 1995 and the 1998 MARCH ON WASHINGTON. The March brought together hundreds of thousands of patients, doctors, researchers and other advocates to support increased bioscience investments.





In the years following the 1998 March, Congress doubled the resources of the National Institutes of Health (NIH) and the National Cancer Institute (NCI) and tripled the budget of the National Science Foundation (NSF). Those investments have paid off immeasurably, setting off a period of extraordinary biomedical discovery and technological advances. More important, those investments have saved millions of lives and given many individuals the invaluable gift of more time with their loved ones.





THREE DAYS TO CHAIGE THE WORLD






